As lawyers, we are obligated by ORPC Rule 1.15 / O.R.C. 4705.09 /O.R.C. 3953.231 to maintain client funds in trust accounts, which include our IOLTA and IOTA.

Annually we need to review our IOLTA to determine whether there are any dormant items. This incudes for example an uncashed client refund check that is three or more years old.

Items such as this uncashed refund check, must be reported to the Ohio Department of Commerce each year as "unclaimed funds." As of November 1, 2025, the Ohio Department of Commerce is no longer accepting "paper" reports. All reports must be made via the Department's website at https://unclaimedfunds.ohio.gov/app/report-unclaimed-funds
